- ✓ Must ordinarily reside in the UK - Must not be on a student visa, skilled worker visa or seasonal worker visa
- ✓ Not have already completed the qualification
- ✓ Not be on any other funded training (e.g. apprenticeship)
- ✓ Reside in South Yorkshire Mayoral Combined Authority – Sheffield, Doncaster, Rotherham, Mexborough, Barnsley
- ✓ Earn below £34,977.43
